### **I am an Einstein employee. Do I still report to work?**

All employees are on call and should follow the direction of their direct supervisor.

### **Do I have to pay for the "Grab and Go" meals?**

No. This is a free service.

### **Who can receive meals and does my child have to be with me?**

It is open to all children ages 18 and under or those who are enrolled in a New Orleans Public School. Your child does not have to be with you.

### **Can I volunteer to help with meal distribution?**

No volunteers are needed at this time. We appreciate the support, but it's best to limit the people involved in the process. We will reach out if we need help in the future.

### **How will the students make up the weeks of missed school?**
